Peter Kingstone has an article accepted to *World Development*, titled “Democracy, History, and Economic Performance: A Case-Study Approach,” co-authored with John Gerring, Matthew Lange, and Aseema Sinha. The article builds on cross-national quantitative work that establishes a positive relationship between the length of time a country is democratic and economic performance. The article

compares Brazil, India, and Mauritius to trace the causal mechanisms underlying the relationship.
