Cyrus Ernesto (“Ernie”) Zirakzadeh has a four-volume anthology in print, titled *Social and Political Movements* (London: Sage Publications). The handbook contains 58 famous essays on social movements and social movement theory over the past 70 years. The volumes are entitled “Theorizing about Movements after World War II,” “Emergence and Evolution of Political-Process Theory,” “Recent Cultural Approaches,” and “Local Conditions and International Contexts.”

In January, **Jennifer Sterling-Folker** became a co-editor of *Review of International Studies* (RIS), which is the flagship journal of the British International Studies Association. Jennifer is the North American representative on a four-person editorial team, which also includes Kimberly Hutchings as lead editor (LSE), George Lawson (LSE), and Mathias Albert (Bielefeld). The journal will be based at the London School of Economics during their five year editorial term. In addition to these new editorial duties, Jennifer continues to co-edit *International*

Studies Review with Mark Boyer here at UConn, and to serve as Series Editor for *Dilemmas in World Politics*.
